The feast of the Ascension is our day to remember all that the Easter season has been. It's a chance to recap our moments of encounter with Christ and our own calls to conversion. There's no reason we can't take time to do our own sky-gazing, knowing that there's more out there than a void. Nobody can tell us that we have to handle snakes (nobody needed to tell me), but if we are open, the Spirit will lead us to be witnesses from wherever we are standing to the ends of the earth.

The Ascension might be our most whimsical feast. The story has nothing of the heaviness we heard at the Last Supper, when Jesus spoke of going away and being lifted up. When we look to the disciples as role models, we can be encouraged by their never-ending need to learn and be reconverted to Jesus' message. We remember that as so many of them were martyred, faith did not deliver them from every danger.



Luke's introduction to the Acts of the Apostles, his second volume on the Christian story, is packed with theology sometimes disguised as anecdote. We get a

sense of his approach as soon as he says that his first book dealt with "all" that Jesus did and taught. That statement alone intimates that each incident he is going to bubbles up with enough meaning to tell the whole story in a nutshell. (I remind you of how John ended his Gospel by saying that the whole world could not contain all the books necessary to describe everything Jesus did.)

Superficially, Luke begins Acts by retelling the story of Jesus' departure, but in reality he's recapping Jesus' entire history: his "appearance," a second 40-day sojourn, a reminder of John the Baptist, teaching about the kingdom of God and the promise of the Spirit. As usual, the disciples (we might want to place ourselves here, along side the disciples) miss the point as they ask about the fulfillment of their expectations for the kind of kingdom they understand. Jesus responds that they are looking for knowledge that is beyond their power to imagine. Rather than seek the fulfillment of their own hopes, he tells them, they should wait for the power of the Holy Spirit, the power that will enable and impel them to communicate his message beyond the limits of their most far-reaching expectations.

The celebration of Christ's ascension focuses our attention on just exactly what Christians are to do now that the historical Jesus is no longer with us. This is Luke's introduction to the life we live: believing in Christ without having known the historical Jesus.

Orange Christian Services Annual Fund Raiser

Orange Christian Services just celebrated its 35th Anniversary of serving all of Orange County. St. Francis Parish Social Ministry is helping OCS with their annual golf fund raiser. OCS receives regular support from their 43 member churches but does not receive funding from United Way.

Due to dwindling food support from SETX Food Bank and rising costs of food, gas, utilities and housing, OCS must find other sources of income and depends greatly on the Annual Golf Tournament to bolster its financial situation. In conjunction with the golf tournament each year, donation envelopes are placed in the pews at St. Francis for

parishioners to donate funds which will be used to purchase food from the SETX Food Bank at a greatly reduced cost. A \$10 donation will buy 62 l/2 pounds of food from the food band and \$100 buys 625 lbs. Could your family afford to contribute \$10 or more to purchase food for the needy in Orange County? 

179 families have pledged \$77,060 which is 99% of our goal from 28% of our parishioners
